TUITION

Much of the TYSA's annual budget is raised by the Board of Directors through fundraisers, grants and donations. Disbursements include concert expenses, instrument and music purchases, administrative and artistic salaries, facility rentals, and scholarships. Every effort is made to keep the annual tuition for our members as low as possible.

Tuition statements are mailed in August. You may pay in full or make regular monthly payments (\$160) due on the 1st of each month. The first payment is due on September 1st and all fees are due by March 1st.

NEED BASED FINANCIAL AID and SCHOLARSHIPS

TYSA understands and appreciates that supporting a student's music education involves a substantial financial commitment on the part of parents/guardians. Scholarships are available with awards based on financial need. The September and October 1st payments must be received before scholarships will be considered.

Scholarship applications are due **August 20**th each year. Applications are also available on our website under the Auditions tab.

TYSA Attire For Concerts

TYSA Concert Dress code is "Concert Black" for all performances.

All TYSA students are asked to choose the components of their concert blacks within the following guidelines:

- solid black long-sleeve dress shirt or long-sleeve blouse (no low necklines or backless choices)
- solid black dress pants, slacks, skirt, or dress (skirt length must be floor length)
- please wear a black belt with your pants/slacks if needed.
- black socks or black opaque stockings/tights
- black dress shoes (heels are not recommended, particularly for performers who stand to perform)

Please note: TYSA students are also permitted to wear the white tuxedo shirt/black slacks/skirt, tux attire, or Angelique dress from previous years if you would like to.

Please do not wear:

- black jeans or leggings
- t-shirts or tank tops
- sneakers, black shoes with colored stripes or logos
- white socks or colored socks other than solid black

INFORMATION ESPECIALLY FOR PARENTS

<u>Volunteer Positions:</u> The Tacoma Youth Symphony Association relies heavily on the assistance of volunteers. Please take the time to call the office (253-627-2792) and offer your services, or submit an interest form at tysamusic.org/volunteer.

<u>Musician Pick-up:</u> It is very important to pick up your child(ren) as soon as rehearsals or other events are over for their safety. Staff members are involved in other activities and are unable to watch children who have been left.

<u>Video Policy:</u> To video tape one of TYSA concerts you must obtain a video pass through the TYSA office. Video passes are available 2 weeks prior to the concert and you must purchase a ticket in order to use the video pass. You must present the pass to an usher who will show you to a video location. **Only two passes are available for each concert.**

Attendance Policy: The Attendance Policy of the Tacoma Youth Symphony Association is strictly enforced. A copy of the policy is included on the following page. Each member is required to attend all performances, retreats and tours of the orchestra of which they are a member.

<u>Parking:</u> Parking is metered by parking meters. Please make sure you provide yourself enough time to get warmed up and settled before the concertmaster tunes. Also allow for enough time at the end of rehearsal for adequate clean-up. Carpooling is strongly encouraged.

<u>Music Folders:</u> Students' music folders will include rehearsal schedules and music. Check the rehearsal schedule to make sure that you are aware of any changes in dates and locations. All music and folders are to be turned in at each concert. Members agree to pay a \$7 fee for each piece of music that is not returned within 30 days of the concert, \$5 for missing Glaesel folders and a \$30 fine for missing TYS black folders. *Copied music is property of TYSA and no student is allowed to keep copied music issued by TYSA*. Above fees apply to copied music as well as original music.

<u>Withdrawal</u>: Please submit in writing to the TYSA office of your child's request to withdraw (including non-acceptance) from TYSA. The day your letter with parent/guardian signature is received by TYSA will be the official withdrawal date. Refunds will be on a case-by-case basis. No refunds after March 1st. There will be no refund of the audition fee if you do not accept placement.

<u>Payments:</u> Please use the payment drop box located inside the TYSA office or mail any payments/money to the TYSA office. Please do not hand checks or cash to TYSA staff on Saturdays or at concerts.

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Your acceptance of membership in TYSA requires that you agree to:

- 1 Work for excellence in the preparation and performance of symphonic literature by personally practicing sufficiently to be well prepared for rehearsals and performances.
- 2 Attend all rehearsals, concerts and out-of-town trips and comply with current procedures and policies pertaining to attendance.
- 3 Be a participating member of your school's instrumental music program.
- 4 Take advantage of other opportunities, such as private lessons, to improve your skills.
- 5 In case of emergency absences, contact the appropriate Rehearsal Assistant.
- 6 Arrive early for all rehearsals and concerts and be attentive before rehearsal begins as well as throughout rehearsal.
- 7 Give the conductor your strict attention. While the TYSA recognizes the importance of socialization, social conversation must be avoided during rehearsals. Cell phones must be in silent mode or off during rehearsals.
- 8 Be a true ambassador for the orchestra by exhibiting proper behavior and dress.
- 9 Maintain professional decorum at concerts by: Using only the performer's entrance; maintaining dignified conduct while entering and exiting the stage during the performance and especially during rests; Remaining backstage until the concert is completed.
- 10 Care for the TYSA's music; return all parts at the conclusion of each concert and agree to pay replacement costs for each piece of music that is not returned.
- 11 Be in proper concert dress for concerts AND appropriate attire for rehearsals.

ATTENDANCE POLICY AND ABSENCE NOTIFICATION PROCEDURES

The very nature of the orchestra experience requires a concerted effort by individuals doing their best at all times. By accepting membership in the Tacoma Youth Symphony Association, each student is expected to fulfill the obligations associated with all performances, retreats and tours as well as the rehearsals for their preparation. A rehearsal schedule will be handed out at the beginning of each concert set to assist the students and their families with planning. In all aspects of this experience, punctuality is essential as is communicating extraordinary personal circumstances to the conductor through the Rehearsal Assistant. Student attendance record is reviewed at the beginning of each season as a factor affecting orchestral placement.

ABSENCE NOTIFICATION PROCEDURE

- 1. Each student is required to attend all performances, retreats and tours of the orchestra of which they are a member.
- 2. If a conflict occurs, the students should identify it as many months in advance as possible and attempt to resolve it to avoid the conflict with the TYSA event.
- 3. If these efforts do not resolve the conflict, the student should inform their conductor and fill out an absence form online. If a student is ill and will not make it to rehearsal, please fill out the absence form online and call the rehearsal assistant. ABSENCES SHOULD BE A RARE OCCURRENCE. For students in leadership positions (principals, assistants and players with one on a part) this is a very serious matter. All forms submitted online should be done by the parent or legal guardian.
- 4. EMERGENCY absences (sudden illness, death in the family, etc.) must be referred to the Rehearsal Assistant as early as possible.
- 5. After three (3) absences within a concert cycle an email will be sent to the parents, asking the student to meet with the conductor to make a plan for the student's ongoing success.

REHEARSALS

Each student must attend every rehearsal and stay to its conclusion. Some works do not require all instruments. Players of such instruments must be in attendance only for that portion of the rehearsal for which they have a part. They may leave only after being dismissed by the conductor.

PUNCTUALITY

Students are expected to arrive at the rehearsal site, be tuned and warmed up by the beginning of the rehearsal; arriving at starting time would make the student late. Being late greatly detracts from the planned group objectives. It is also a requirement to be in place and on time after scheduled breaks. Students who enter a rehearsal late for any reason must check in with the Rehearsal Assistant.

CONCERT VIDEOTAPING POLICY

The Tacoma Youth Symphony Association is dedicated to providing the optimal performance and listening experience to our students and audiences. We strive to maintain a professional atmosphere keeping distractions to a minimum, thus ensuring the best performances possible.

To support this conviction, we must limit the number of individuals allowed to videotape our performances. Unfortunately, we cannot accommodate all requests. If one desires to videotape a performance they need to request a video pass and purchase a reserved seat, available through the TYSA office, in the section of the balcony specific to these purposes. One must present the pass and reserved ticket to an usher. Only two passes will be available for each concert. If the areas reserved for wheelchairs are available, then and only then will additional videotaping equipment be allowed in that area.

Priority issuance of video passes will be given to those families who have soloists performing in the concert. Additionally, we will request that those families with video passes be willing to provide copies to other families at cost.
