







In Loving Memory of Shirley Getzin, TYSA's First Executive Director

Shirley Getzin passed away on September 10 surrounded by her family, love, and music. Those three things really defined who Mrs. Getzin was. As a parent of a TYSA student in the 1970s, Shirley brought her son to his TYSA rehearsal every week and stayed through his rehearsal. Then-current TYS conductor, C. Irvin Wright, noticed Shirley at rehearsals and when someone was needed to clean up an office space at Remann Hall for TYSA use, he recommended Shirley for the job. Shirley was named Executive Secretary and then soon became Executive Director, the first paid TYSA administrative staff position. She served TYSA in that position from 1976 until her retirement in 1997. She considered the Tacoma Youth Symphony Association her greatest joy.

Shirley credited her success as the first TYSA Executive Director to her love of people and love of music. Along with her love of people, she was good at persuading people to give, and she was an effective fundraiser. During her time at TYSA, she oversaw TYSA's largest expansion. In 1976, there were two orchestras. During the 1980s, TYSA added the Tacoma Young Artists Orchestra, Tacoma String Symphony, the Symphonic Wind Arts Training program, Evergreen Music Festival, and String Orchestra Festival. The Tacoma String Philharmonic and Tacoma Classical Youth Sinfonia were added in the 90s, just before Shirley retired. She was also responsible for TYSA's move to the offices in the Jones Building above the Pantages Theater (TYSA's current home) and she was involved with the remodeling of Studios 2 and 3 (that TYSA currently uses for rehearsals) and the remodeling of the Rialto Theater which opened in 1992 as the home of the Tacoma Youth Symphony.

In 1983, the Tacoma Youth Symphony went on a six-country tour in Europe. The European tour was one of the greatest highlights of Shirley's career with TYSA and a highlight for the students that went on the tour. Shirley's fundraising skills went a long way towards making that tour happen, but her love for the TYSA students was a big part of what made that trip so memorable for her and made her time as Executive Director so special.

Following her retirement from TYSA, Shirley served on the Board of Good Samaritan Hospital in Puyallup and then for the Good Samaritan Hospital Foundation. One of the things she was most proud of was helping to build the Children's Therapy Unit at Good Sam. She also helped to raise money to build the cancer center at Good Sam. Shirley was a devoted community member, and in addition to her volunteer work with Good Samaritan Hospital, she also supported the Junior Women's Club, American Field Service, The Rose Society of Pierce County, P.E.O., Planned Parenthood, and Valley Theater of the Arts.

The Tacoma Youth Symphony will be honoring this remarkable woman at their November 15 concert. Please join us in celebrating her life and legacy. Tickets are available at www. tysamusic.org.


